*****Lunch Bunch will NOT be offered 1 day each month so we can hold our monthly Staff Meetings.

Lunch Bunch offers our students opportunities for additional socialization through meal time, extended activities and play. We provide a safe, nurturing place where the children can eat lunch with their peers, while learning to manage and clean up their own space, with the bonus of added time to socialize and play with their friends. With the company of our supportive teachers, Lunch Bunch kiddos can acclimate to a longer school day, can make mistakes (such as spills) and be helped to fix them, and can gain confidence and independence. Lunch Time is very fast in elementary school and here at Hope we believe in providing Lunch Bunch as an opportunity for our students to practice the "soft skills" needed for kindergarten success.

HEALTHY LUNCHES FOR PRESCHOOLERS

Per state recommendations we encourage you to **pack 1 item from each of the following categories** in your child's lunch, with MILK or WATER as the drink:

Fruits: bananas, applesauce, cantaloupe, peaches, fruit cocktail, pineapple, strawberries, watermelon, raisins (Grapes MUST be cut into small pieces due to choking hazard)

Vegetables (with dips, ranch, hummus, if desired): broccoli, carrot sticks, pumpkin, peppers, tomatoes, beans, potatoes

Grains: bagels, bread, oatmeal, crackers, pasta, rice, cereal, pancakes, muffins, waffles, tortillas

Protein: turkey, chicken, eggs, beans, hamburger, tuna, peanut butter

Dairy: yogurt, cheese, low-fat milk, pudding

Connection Requires Four Critical Elements:

Eye Contact



Get eye contact for a brief moment. When two eyes meet, a wireless connection is created between the orbital frontal areas of the prefrontal lobes. From this connection we literally download inner states into one another. The eyes contain nerve projections that lead directly to key brain structures for empathy and matching emotions. As soon as you have eye contact, download. "There you are. You're safe. Breathe with me. You can handle this."

Presence



Being present in the moment means your mind and body are in the same place. Your mind is free of constant chatter. You are still enough to see the beauty in the child. It is about acceptance. We join together and share the same moment. The present moment is where the joy lies. Relax into it. "Mirror neurons ensure the moment someone sees an emotion on your face, they will at once sense the same feeling within themselves." - Daniel Stern

Touch



<u>Touch</u> is the only sense we cannot live without. The skin and brain are made up of hte same embryonic tissue. The skin is the outside layer of the brain. Touch creates a hormone that is essential to neural functioning and learning. If we want smart, happy kids then we need to provide more appropriate, caring touch.

Playfulness



Being playful in the context of the situation:

Playfulness helps build bonds and creates a biochemistry in the brain for dopamine. Dopamine says, "Pay attention, stay focused." The dopamine system is strengthened, as are attention span and social development in playful situations.

ASQ-3 is a set of questionnaires about children's development. It has been used for more than 20 years to make sure children are developing well. A screening provides a quick look at how children are doing in important areas, such as communication, physical ability, social skills, and problem-solving skills. ASQ-3 can help identify your child's strengths as well as any areas where your child may need support.

As a parent or caregiver, you are the best source of information about your child. That's why ASQ-3 questionnaires are designed to be filled out by you. You will only need 10–15 minutes. It's that quick and easy.

Here's how ASQ-3 works:

- You will answer each question "yes," "sometimes," or "not yet," based on what your child is able to do now. Your answers help show your child's strengths and areas where he or she may need practice.
- To answer each question, you can try fun and simple activities with your child. These activities encourage your child to play, move around, and practice day-to-day skills.

You are your child's first and most important teacher and an active partner in your child's learning and development. Watch for the ASQ in your mailbox soon!


