Our Purpose

- To recognize the uniqueness of each child and encourage self-esteem and individuality.
- To provide a strong, developmentally appropriate academic foundation for each child, helping to ensure future success through kindergarten transition and beyond.
- To provide purposeful work times and opportunities for children to ask questions, pursue ideas, get messy and creative, and thrive.
- To encourage each child to be concerned for others, to cooperate in work and play, and to develop a spirit of sharing.
- To provide an environment where Christian values are not just studied, but lived, with teachers showing examples of Christ's way of love, acceptance and forgiveness.
- To form a partnership with families that encourages growth and success for each child.

Our Program Consists of...

- Degreed/Certified Christian teachers who care about your child's total development and continually work to broaden their knowledge of Early Childhood Education.
- Hands-on experiences which are developmentally appropriate to each child's stage of development.
- Planned experiences for the WHOLE child.

THE TWO-YEAR OLD CLASS is a three-hour class that meets two days a week in which a variety of developmentally appropriate learning activities occur. Structuring the environment and planning activities for self-directed play, social interaction and learning is a fundamental part of the program. Curriculum activities include dramatic play, open-ended creative and sensory experiences (painting, sand and water play, modeling clay, collage activities, etc), construction activities with blocks and manipulative toys, gardening and outdoor activities. Different colors, animals, foods, numbers, shapes, and other topics are explored each day with books, art, and songs. The children get lots of love, attention, and nurturing everyday to make sure they feel safe, secure, and happy. Children do not have to be potty trained to join this class.

THE THREE-YEAR OLD CLASSES meet for three hours each day, two or three days per week. This class works toward helping the children verbalize their feelings and needs and toward developing positive social relations. At three, there is more role-play and more cooperative play. By the end of the year, playgroups have increased in size with four or five children interacting in the housekeeping corner or on the playground with imaginative play. There are group times, which include songs, stories, finger plays, art, music, and fun body movement activities. In addition, the children get a strong introduction to early childhood academics. Name and letter recognition, number recognition, one to one correspondence, shapes, etc. are explored and the children get a chance to enhance this academic learning with art projects, activities, and class themes. Games and activities also include making and identifying patterns, shapes, numbers, counting, and sorting. Every day the children have fun and gain a sense of pride and accomplishment with a specific job they are assigned. The children's fine motor skills are strengthened during art activities and children are encouraged to express themselves in the writing center.

THE FOUR-YEAR OLD PRE-KINDERGARTEN CLASSES meet for three hours, three or four days per week. All children in this group, by age, will be eligible for Kindergarten the following year. A typical day in this program provides developmentally appropriate experiences in all domains: cognitive, social, emotional, physical and spiritual. This theme and center-based program allows children to utilize materials in more complex and extended ways. Many of the activities promote the children's phonemic awareness and are critical to early reading success. Early mathematical skills are also developed with graphing, sorting, counting, and basic addition and subtraction. The children practice writing letters and numbers in different activities daily. They also improve their fine motor skills with activities including cutting, painting, coloring, and gluing. Scientific topics are presented to the children in fun and interesting, hands-on ways. Problem solving and other social emotional skills are practiced and modeled daily.

All of our classes include the following:

- Opening Circle (welcome, story time, calendar, music, etc.)
- Small Group Time (art, science, math, writing, reading, etc)
- Outdoor Time (every day the children have large motor skill play in the outdoor play area)
- Bathroom/Handwashing/Snack
- Music/Movement
- Quiet Reading
- Free Choice (small group activities, interest centers open for learning, free play, creative art activities, math and science experiences)



SCHEDULE AND FEES FOR FALL/SPRING 2018-2019

All tuition is based on a yearly amount and is payable in ten installments for August through May school year. Tuition payments are due on the 1st of the month.

A non-refundable **registration fee of \$150.00** is payable upon enrollment.

Please read and initial the following statements. If you have questions, please do not initial any item until you have had your question answered by the CoH staff and understand it completely.

_____ I understand that all programs are based on meeting minimum enrollment requirements.

_____ I understand that registration fees and tuition are based on an annual rate and cannot be pro-rated or refunded under any circumstance (illness, vacation, holidays, etc.)

_____ I understand that tuition is due on the 1st of each month, August – May. Tuition is late if received after the 10th. Auto pay can be set up through your bank. I understand that I can be assessed a \$15 late fee for payments received or postmarked after the due date and a \$15 late fee for NSF checks.

_____ I understand that registration is for the entire school year. In the event that I need to withdraw my child, I will give the preschool a 30-day written notice. If I fail to comply with this requirement, I will be charged one month's tuition to cover any monetary loss incurred by the preschool.

_____ I understand that I must maintain updated medical information annually and be current on all immunizations required by the Department of Health.

_____ I understand that children too sick to participate in the full program (indoor and outdoor) must be kept home. I understand my child may return to school when fever and vomit free for 24 hours. Parents are to notify the preschool office of any absences and any contagious disease/illness (480-759-1515 Ext. 4).

_____ I understand the importance of reading all information provided to me by CoH staff in a timely fashion including my Family Handbook, emails, notes, newsletters, flyers and Parent Orientation Packet.
